PORTS OF ENTRY TO GUANGZHOU

AIR: Guangzhou Bai Yun International Airport is one of the three largest air hubs in China servicing multiple international and domestic routes

RAIL: The city boasts three intercity railway stations handling passenger transport on both bullet and regular train services. Direct connections include Beijing, Wuhan, Nanjing, Chengdu, Chongqing, Xian, Shenzhen and Hong Kong

SEA: Panyu Lianhuashan Port provides high speed passenger ferries to Hong Kong on a daily basis
